<p>Be Class Representatives Each class should have a rep nominated by the staff. The rep will usually hold the position for a half term, although this can be flexible. <p>Be Play leaders Year 5/6 will all be trained as Play leaders. A number of pupils are then selected and their responsibility will be to come up with a plan and run lunchtime games and activities aimed to suit the whole school.
