History – The Great Fire of London

In this topic, the children are going to learn about the Great Fire of London and how shaped the world that we live in today.

The children will need to have a secure understanding of where London is and what it looks like today. This may require some pre-teaching so that the children can recall key information for comparisons.

The topic begins by describing London during the Tudor era. The children will find this easier to comprehend if they have an understand of how London looks today. It may also be useful to display a timeline to help them to understand when the Stuart era was and how long ago.

The lessons then go through each of the significant events that took place during the Great Fire. As well as the significant people who documented the event.

Science

This 'Everyday Materials' unit will teach us about everyday materials including wood, plastic, metal, water and rock.

We will learn to identify and name everyday materials and will have the opportunity to explore the properties of these materials.

Geography

In this unit, the children will learn that the Earth is divided into seven continents and five oceans. They will use world maps, atlases and globes and will learn to identify these continents and oceans.

They will learn the difference between human and physical features and will be able to recognise these when using aerial photographs. They will learn about key human and physical features in each of the continents and why these are important.
